The *Journal of Faculty Development* invites manuscripts for the May 2021 special section that focus on **Faculty Development Transparent Teaching & Learning**. Transparent assignment design is shown to increase students' potential to succeed while reducing inequities in the learning process (Winkelmes et al., 2016). Winkelmes et al. (2019) have discussed transparent design approaches for faculty developers. This call invites new or emerging perspectives on faculty development that furthers understandings of transparent teaching and learning.

For this special section, *JFD* is seeking full manuscripts that address but are not limited to the following topics:

- Use of technology to enhance faculty development focused on transparent teaching and learning;
- Faculty development initiatives, programs, and processes that promote transparency in teaching and learning;

- Strategies for incorporating diversity, culturally responsive pedagogy, and/or inclusive excellence into transparent teaching and learning;
- Student perspectives that inform faculty development focused on transparent teaching and learning.
