Arriving into Washington, DC

Washington, DC is a top destination for domestic and international travelers. There are four main hubs: three airports and one train station.

✈️ DCA

Reagan National Airport primarily receives domestic travelers. The exceptions are flights from Mexico and Canada. The airport resides in Arlington, Virginia, only a few miles from the DC border. The modes of transportation available upon arrival are subway, taxi, Uber, and car service. Shuttle buses only run to the local Virginia Hotels, not to hotels in Washington, DC. Taxis and Uber are readily available at the airport, while car services start at \$100 or more, depending on the group size.

✈️ IAD

Dulles International Airport handles both domestic and international flights. It is located in Chantilly, VA, roughly 25 miles from Washington, DC. Modes of transportation include the subway (approximately a 2-hour ride), taxi/Uber (45-60 minutes), or car service. Taxis typically cost around \$70, and Uber fares can be lower but may surge at times. Car services begin at \$200.00 and up, depending on the size of the party.

✈️ BWI

Baltimore Washington International Airport receives both domestic and international travelers. It is approximately 40+ miles from Washington, DC. The modes of transportation are the MARC train to Union Station, taxi/Uber (60-90 mins), and car services. Shuttle services are available through Go Shuttle. Taxi fares are estimated at around \$100, while Uber costs may vary based on demand, traffic, and other factors. The MARC train, costing \$8, arrives at Union Station in DC, where a short taxi or Uber ride can take you to your final destination. Car services start at \$250, depending on the size of the group.

🚆 Union Station (train)

Union Station is the only train station in Washington, DC. It is geographically located in the center of DC between the 4 quadrants, NW, NE, SE, and SW, just three blocks from the US Capitol. Union Station is serviced by Amtrak, MARC (local train), VRE (local train), and METRO (Subway station). It is also the location of many interstate bus companies. Most destinations in DC are just a short taxi or Uber ride away. The Union Station Metro stop is on the Red Line, providing easy connections to all other lines in the DC metro area.

The Washington Hilton is conveniently located just a short metro ride from the National Mall and a 10-minute walk from the Dupont Circle Metro Station on the Red Line.

Getting to the Hotel via Metro

From DCA: Take the Yellow Line toward Greenbelt. Transfer to the Red Line at Gallery Place/Chinatown, heading toward Shady Grove. Get off at the DuPont Circle station and exit via the Q Street exit. From there, walk 0.4 miles straight up Connecticut Avenue heading north (uphill) to reach the hotel.



From IAD: Take the Silver Line toward Downtown Largo. At Metro Center station, transfer to the Red Line heading toward Shady Grove. Get off at the DuPont Circle station and use the Q Street exit. From there, walk 0.4 miles straight up Connecticut Avenue heading north (uphill) to reach the hotel.
